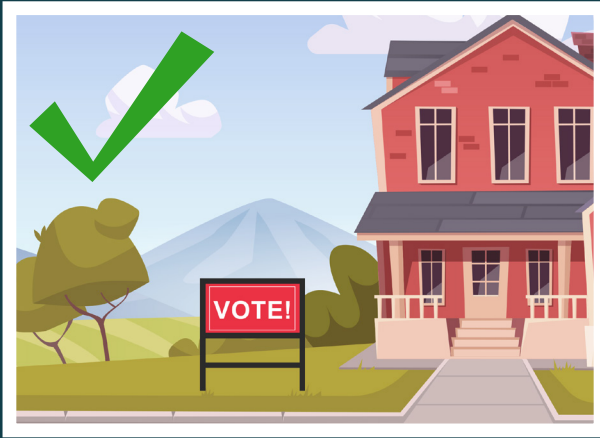


# POLITICAL CAMPAIGN SIGNS



On private property, they are colorful symbols, a tradition and a staple of political campaigns that represents an America hard-fought freedom. Here's the scoop on how to keep Kingsburg beautiful and keep it legal.

- Post signs on private property with prior consent of the property owner.
- Post signs in storefront windows with prior consent of the property owner.
- Post signs between **April 3, 2026 - June 8, 2026** (remove within 6 days after the election). (**Kingsburg Municode 17.56.040**)
- Place signs on private property behind the sidewalk.
- Report illegally posted political signs to **Code Enforcement with Service Request** on our city's website [www.cityofkingsburg-ca.gov](http://www.cityofkingsburg-ca.gov), calling 559-897-6520 or emailing the City Clerk at [apalsgaard@cityofkingsburg-ca.gov](mailto:apalsgaard@cityofkingsburg-ca.gov)
- Remove signs no later than **June 12, 2026**.
- Be respectful of fellow candidates!



# POLITICAL CAMPAIGN SIGNS

# DO NOT

- **DO NOT** place within any public right of way including but not limited to, public trees, telephone poles, traffic signs, utility or street light poles and other objects in the public right of way.
- **DO NOT** place signs on City property, including but not limited to, trees, medians, sidewalks, parkways, parks, municipal facilities, and drainage and/ or utility easements.
- **DO NOT** place signs on school property.
- **DO NOT** place signs that block the line of sight or pose a hazard.
- **DO NOT** place signs on private property without property owners permission.
- **DO NOT** remove other candidates' signs (per CA Penal Code 488 it is a misdemeanor).
- **DO NOT** post signs before April 3, 2026.
